
Education

To cater for our increased staff strength, a modern administrative building was constructed, boasting air-conditioned offices, an executive conference room, Uninterrupted Power Supply during work hours and advanced security with CCTV. The building was inaugurated by Governor Babajide Olusola Sanwo-Olu.



OTUNBA BUSURA ALEBIOSU MULTIPURPOSE BUILDING



The new Agboyi-Ketu LCDA Administrative Building is a state-of-the-art, three-story multipurpose facility designed to enhance our administrative efficiency. This modern architectural masterpiece includes 80 offices, a legislative chamber, a modern registry, and a hall. Each space is equipped with the latest amenities to provide a productive working environment for our staff and elected officials.

The building aims to centralize our operations, improve service delivery, and provide a conducive environment for governance. By housing the Legislative Arms and various administrative functions under one roof, we are fostering a more organized and efficient local government. This facility not only meets current needs but also anticipates future growth, ensuring long-term functionality and resilience.

The Property and Investment Board

As a measure to address the housing deficit in our LCDA to enhance socio-economic development by generating employment and bolstering the council's Internal Generated Revenue, the Mayor Dele Oshinowo administration in its first week in office in the year 2017 inaugurated the Property and Investment Board. The core objective of the board is to help the LCDA to identify strategic steps to manage its real estate portfolio and ways to generate revenue from the various real estate holdings of the council.

Indeed, the remarkable journey so far in the housing sector has heralded a lush green residential environment in the Ajelogo Area with the springing up of Greenwich Garden, Raymond Estate, Sterling Height and the upcoming Lagos Homes.

Identifying all the LCDA's investment opportunities.



Identifying under-utilized Government properties and designing innovative ways of generating revenue from them.



Utilizing public, private partnerships (PPP) in developing the Council's infrastructure investment.



Regularization of LCDA title documents at the Lands' Bureau



Supervising all of the Council's construction projects in order to ensure that they meet building and regulatory standards.



Providing advice to the Executive Chairman to ensure that the Council's interests are protected as it makes investments.

The Property and Investment Board

Achievements of the Property & Investment Board



A landmark achievement is the successful regeneration of Agboyi-Ketu and the transformation of the LCDA from slum to a mega-city, which is in line with the Lagos Mega City vision, including relocating residents and creating over 1,000 housing units (170 plots and 266 units) through the Site and Service scheme. This crucial step has significantly addressed housing shortages, contributed to urban regeneration, and improved the overall quality of life.



Highly instrumental to the development and completion of Akanimodo/ Ajelogo Housing Scheme. 120 lock-up shops have been commissioned, while 42 residential apartments at Raymond Estate; 104 apartments at Sterling Heights; and 81 residential apartments at Greenwich Gardens totaling 227 housing units are awaiting commissioning by the Executive Governor of Lagos State, Mr. Babajide Sanwo-olu.



The Board has successfully introduced and delivered 98 sites and service plots of land at Akanimodo/Ajelogo Housing Scheme, through the support of Lagos State Governor- Mr. Babajide Sanwoolu, New Town Development Authority (NTDA), and Joint Venture Partner.



Redevelopment of Mandela Market at Mile 12. The project comprises of 300 Lock-up Shops, and 88 K-clamps

The Property and Investment Board

Achievements of the Property & Investment Board (Contd.)



Redevelopment of Ifelodun Plank Market, Ketu. This market was burnt some years ago. The composition of the redevelopment included 60 units of Lock-up shops, 30 units of en-suite shops, 120 units of K-clamp, and 10 units of machine shops



Procured and obtained title (Certificate of Occupancy) to all the LCDA land and landed properties- LCDA Secretariat, Mascara Area Office, Owode- Onirin Market, Mandela Market, Tipper Garage, Akinyemi Primary Health Centre, Ajegunle Primary Health Care, and Agboyi Primary Health Care.



Real Estate development performance comprises of 728 units shops/ K-clamps, 98 serviced plots, and 285 residential housing units, totalling 1013 commercial and residential housing units delivered in the year under review.



Raised the revenue profile of the LCDA by over 500 per cent through premium, accrued units of apartments, administrative charges, and legal fees.




INDUSTRIAL BOREHOLE

In our continuous efforts to improve public health and infrastructure, we have also addressed the water scarcity issue that has been prevalent in Agboyi Island. A 130m deep industrial borehole was strategically constructed, serving over 20 communities and significantly contributing to the reduction of water-borne diseases.

This initiative has ensured the provision of clean and safe drinking water, enhancing the overall health and well-being of our residents. This move is particularly important as it aligns with our commitment to achieving the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), specifically SDG 6: Clean Water and Sanitation.

This project was not only aimed at developing the infrastructure of the region but also aimed at promoting local businesses and encouraging economic growth




Market Mobility Infrastructure



Distribution of Patrol Vehicles




Distribution of Patrol Motorcycles


Free Eye Care Programme


• Support for Vulnerable Groups

• Essential Goods Assistance

Addressing the amplified essential costs, food banks will dot various LCDA locations, guaranteeing sustenance accessibility for all.



• Educational Support

In tandem with a summer school camp by the LCDA, students will receive vital school supplies, ensuring uninterrupted education despite fiscal strains.



• Agboyi-Ketu Cowry Card (TIP Card)

An innovation to ease the rising living costs, these pre-loaded cards, available for low-income earners, can be utilized on specific BRT routes, Lagos State Ferries, and to obtain essentials from our food banks. A modest step, but a transformative one for those grappling with these economic shifts.


